



**Location:** Route from Ceredo and Lenore along the West Fork of Twelvepole Creek **Type:** Roads/Tunnels/ Bridges

Length: 54 miles from Lenore to Wayne and 21 miles from Lenore to Wayne County line

**Year constructed: 1890s** 

Contractor: Norfolk and Western Railroad

The alignment remains in use as a roadway to this day, although most of the original railroad structures in Mingo County have been demolished. Currently four bridges remain but are scheduled to be replaced by 2023. The Dingess Tunnel and Breeden Tunnel remain in operation, both of which are eligible for the National Register of Historic Places.

The Twelvepole Line is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion A for significance with opening the area for economic development and development of the West Virginia coalfields.
