



Nicut Run Bridge History

Nicut Run Ribbed Arch is located in Calhoun County and carries County Route 11 over Left Fork West Fork of Little Kanawha River. The bridge consists of a simple span reinforced concrete arch supported by concrete footings. It is a one lane bridge that is 58 feet long and 18 feet wide. It was built in 1926 by the Luten Bridge Company and consists of two closed spandrel elliptical arch ribs supporting the deck slab. The existing bridge is seriously deteriorated and the condition is rated as poor. The bridge is scheduled to be replaced in 2019.

Nicut Run Ribbed Arch Bridge is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion C as an example of a spandrel braced arch, an uncommon bridge type. It is also associated with nationally recognized bridge designer Daniel Luten.
